God knows how to bring a resurrection

Gulf Coast Jurisdiction celebrates Bishop Charles D. Smith's appreciation/birthday

FORT WALTON BEACH, FLA. – The Gulf Coast Jurisdiction celebrated the pastoral appreciation and 67th birthday of its bishop at an annual meeting.

The event, held Feb. 9-11, at Promise Church, 716 Edge St., opened that Friday night. Gulf Coast pastors encouraged the saints that Jesus is coming soon, so work out your own salvation.

Bishop Charles D. Smith, Presiding Bishop of Gulf Coast Jurisdiction encouraged the pastors and elders in the Saturday morning seminar that, pastors should have the heart of God. “Pastor must give people the gospel according to God’s heart. He was referring to the scripture in Jeramiah 3:15.

“The most important person in the church is the pastor. People will stay in the church, because of the pastor. ‘Imposed discipline’ does not happen in the church, pastors must win the people,” said Bishop Smith. “Pastors must do everything in the church to win the congregation within the parameters of the gospel. Pastors must have the right mind and spirit before they talk to people that visit the church to know what to say. The wisdom and knowledge from God’s heart gives eternal life,” he added.

Bishop Smith said, “Pastors must see the rebellion in themselves through the people. Only by free will of the people, does God get the glory.” “When we preach, we have to be pure enough so the Holy Spirit touches the spirit of the people. Pastors are to serve the people,” he added.

The banquet gave district superintendents, pastors, elders, ministers and lay members the opportunity to present gifts and give encouraging words to Bishop Smith.

Bishop Smith closed the banquet by thanking everyone for coming. “I appreciate you taking time to attend this appreciation and pray that God will bless you richly for your giving and encouraging words,” he said.



A yoke-breaking service followed the banquet and the pastors encouraged the people not to forget all God has done, but be thankful and endure to the end, because Jesus is coming soon.

Bishop Smith culminated his three-day appreciation weekend on Sunday morning with a word for the people about the Prophet Elijah and the Widow woman (1 Kings 17). “Some people were in a famine and had no hope and other people had God. The devil wants you to focus your attention from God and look at the famine. God told the woman to expect the Man of God,” he said.

Referring to when Elijah told the Widow woman to make him a little cake, Bishop Smith said, “Sometimes God will say let something go, because God is going to bless you. Sometimes you can hold on to something too tight until you cannot get what God has for you. God sent the famine, but He told the people, who would listen, it will be alright, because you will have a better meal barrel and cruise of oil.”

Bishop Smith closed by saying, “God knows how to bring about a resurrection. Have faith in God and we ought to obey God.”


