GCJ Missionaries reconciling the lost at all cost

Annual Missions Conference filled with seminars, canvassing and preaching

MONTGOMERY, ALA. – “And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation.” (2 Corinthians 5:18) Preachers reminded the saints at the Gulf Coast Jurisdiction’s Annual Missions Conference that they are new creatures in Christ and should reconcile the lost to Christ at all cost.

The conference, held March 10 and 11 at New Covenant Church of the Living God International (CLGI) in Montgomery Ala., started with various seminars and workshops.

Bishop Charles D. Smith, Gulf Coast Jurisdiction Presiding Bishop and Pastor of Promise Church of the Living God International, Fort Walton Beach, Fla., encouraged the saints from 1 Corinthians 9:19-23 and Colossians 3:15-17. “More important than changing your clothes is changing your mind,” he said. “There are only two sins that you cannot be forgiven for: blasphemy of the Holy Ghost and unforgiveness.”

He further encouraged saints that, “Holy Ghost filled people must seek peace. If you want to see if God is in something, look for peace. The devil identifies problems, but the Holy Ghost gives solutions. You cannot fight for God unless you are right.”

The seminars continued as the Gulf Coast Jurisdictional Missions Director, Elder Treani Thompson, who is also the Assistant Pastor at Christ the Redeemer CLGI in Gulfport, Miss., took this opportunity to give refresher training and a leadership workshop to all local GCJ Missions Coordinators. Meanwhile, Minister Tabitha Hines, assistant GCJ Missions Director, Lily of the

Valley CLGI, Thonotosassa, Fla., taught the junior missionaries about canvassing and witnessing. They then went throughout the local neighborhood practicing what they had learned.

A combined session with Minister Dorothy Negley, GCJ Missions Treasurer, Spirit of Christ CLGI, Fort Walton Beach, Fla. and Minister Traci Coleman, Missions Coordinator, Sword of the Spirit CLGI, Lansdown, Pa., culminated the seminars.

They encouraged the saints on effective witnessing, understanding people and seeing the value in everyone. “It takes a willing mind” was the title of Minister Negley’s seminar as she taught about the brain and how it works, so that saints could gain insight into the, “taken-for-granted” knowledge needed to survive in various social classes.

“Some of us have fixed mindsets, growth mindsets and mindsets that are developed by experience, but we may need to change in order to do outreach and be an effective witness for Christ,” said Minister Negley.

Minister Coleman, whose profession is in social work, said, “We must take people as they are and not look down on them. If we’re going to be effective in witnessing, we must first examine ourselves.” She added, “We have to come out of our traditions and be what people need. We have to be kind in the church to the saints and visitors. I challenge you to think differently!”

The Saturday night service was a blessing as Minister Hines and Minister Georgia Armstrong, the CLGI Missions Secretary, Atlanta Worship Center, Atlanta, Ga., encouraged the saints to work in the church and stand until Jesus comes.

“I don’t want my labor to be in vain,” said Minister Armstrong. “When we get the Word of God, it is not just for us, but we must give it to someone else so they can be saved. We must be a beacon of light in a time of darkness. The Holy Spirit does not bring death, but life,” she said.

Minister Hines encouraged the saints not to faint, but do all to stand. “I am not ashamed of the Gospel of Christ, because it is the power of God unto salvation. If you’re in the fellowship of the saints, every band in your life can be loosed.”

Elder Thompson wrapped up the preaching at the conference on Sunday morning by encouraging the missionaries not to forget where they came from and do not turn around. “God is still faithful and we need to remain faithful as well. Be steadfast in the faith and let no man steal your crown.” “When we witness to people, they need to know that God can wash and cleanse them and they can have peace with God,” she said.

Bishop Smith closed the conference by thanking everyone for coming and saying, “Missions work is important and in God we need to find out what is important to God. Spiritual means that we learn how to follow the Spirit.”


The Bishop's Corner
