## **Bishop Smith told the GCJ Saints to work out their salvation**

FORT WALTON BEACH, FLA. – “We must figure out how to work out our salvation (Philippians 2:12) because sinners have worldly wisdom and know how to make it through life,” said Bishop Charles D. Smith, Gulf Coast Jurisdictional Bishop and Pastor of Promise Church via Zoom on Friday night, August 7, 2020.


Because of the Coronavirus pandemic, Bishop Smith has been teaching, using Zoom on Sunday mornings, Tuesday and Friday nights during these times of stay-at-home orders in effect in many states.

“We need God because we want eternal life and to make it to heaven. Salvation is better than all the money in the world; therefore we should not let anyone or anything separate us from God (Romans 8:38-39),” said Bishop Smith.

Teaching from Luke 16 and focusing on verse 8, which states: “And the Lord commended the unjust steward, because he had done wisely: for the children of this world are in their generation wiser than the children of light.” Bishop Smith said that we should not let the sinners make us think that their lives are better than ours.

God wanted Israel to drive all the inhabitants out of the promise land when they came over the river Jordan, but Israel decided they could live with the inhabitants. When we come out of sin, and God tells us to let things go and we don’t, the devil deceives us and those things become snares. Such was the case for Ahab who would not obey God so God let him fall. “And the Lord said, Who shall persuade Ahab, that he may go up and fall at Ramoth-gilead? And one said on this manner, and another said on that manner. Now therefore, behold, the Lord hath put a lying spirit in the mouth of all these thy prophets, and the Lord hath spoken evil concerning thee (I Kings 22:20, 23).”

As closing remarks, Bishop Smith advised that if we are in a church where the gospel is being preached, we should have our minds made up about being saved because if we decide we want to go back into the world, God is not going to stop us.

Praise the Lord Saints,

“But without faith it is impossible to please Him: for he that cometh to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of them that diligently seek Him (Hebrews 11:6).”


“Cast not away therefore your confidence, which hath great recompence of reward. For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise. For yet a little while, and He that shall come will come, and will not tarry. Now the just shall live by faith: but if any man draw back, my soul shall have no pleasure in him. But we are not of them who draw back unto perdition; but of them that believe to the saving of the soul (Hebrews 10:35-39).”

The main point in the verses above is, “after ye have done the will of God.” The reason we are saved and on the earth is to be lights in the world, glorify God and turn people from sin to God (Matthew 5:14-16). We need to ask God to search us so we can see if we are doing His will or what hinders us from doing His will (Psalms 139:23-24). God is perfect, so he is never the hold-up or problem; it is us. God is faithful and dependable; He never comes up short.

“Wherefore, seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith: who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God (Hebrews 12:1-2).” There is nothing worse than being led away from God; this is why we must have patience and hold on to our faith.
