God heard our prayers. Ezekiel was born prematurely at 26 weeks, weighed only 2 lbs., 5 oz., and was only 14 inches long. He had bleeding on his brain, and the doctors placed him in the NICU, giving him only one week to live. We needed God to move immediately, and thanks to His goodness and mercy, He did it! Ezekiel now weighs 3 lbs. and 14 oz., 1760 grams, only (2 oz) away from 4 lbs. He has gained 50+ grams a night for a month. He has passed all his breathing tests and was trialed on how long he can breathe on his own with no support. He did well. He had good color in his skin and was taken off the ventilator, and I got to hear him cry for the first time! Ezekiel is now wearing new-born size diapers. His lungs are developing well and the bleeding in his brain has stabilized. The doctors say that we won't be

able to tell that Ezekiel ever had a brain bleed. Next, they will work toward an open crib and latching to a bottle. Thus far, they have been able to successfully begin breastfeeding. Thank you, Lord, for your miracle-working power!
