Bishop Smith encourages the GCJ saints to follow Jesus

FORT WALTON BEACH, FLA. – "Jesus said to follow Him and become His disciple," said Bishop Charles D. Smith, Gulf Coast Jurisdictional Bishop and Pastor of Promise Church while teaching bible study on Tuesday night, January 24, 2023. Those who could not make it to the church were able to participate via Zoom.

"Jesus knew that His ministry was going to be short, so He needed the 12 disciples to be ready to preach when He went back to Heaven," said Bishop Smith. "The difference between the disciples and us today is that they gave their whole self to God."

Bishop Smith encouraged the saints from Luke 5:9-11, which says, "For he and all who were with him were astonished at the catch of fish which



they had taken; and so also were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. And Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid. From now on you will catch men.' So, when they had brought their boats to land, they forsook all and followed Him (NKJV)." Bishop Smith said, "Jesus chose these 12 disciples because He was going to give them a lot of power, and they needed to have Jesus' mind. We must also have Jesus' mind in order to get people saved today."

In Matthew chapter 19, Bishop Smith encouraged the saints to give up all and follow Jesus because He has the power to bless them in this life and also give them eternal life. "And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or fathers or mothers or wife or children or lands, for My name's sake, shall receive a hundredfold, and inherit eternal life (Matthew 19:29 NKJV)."

Bishop Smith reminded the saints what Jesus said about rich people and how hard it was for them to make it to heaven. "It's mainly because rich people can't buy happiness, joy and peace. They have a void that only God can fill and they can't buy God. The devil will do anything he can to destroy or weaken saved people. If it takes money, then he will give them money," said Bishop Smith. He concluded by encouraging the saints to follow Jesus and put Him first in their lives.


The Bishop's Corner

Preach: The Kingdom of Heaven is at Hand

Praise the Lord Saints,

"From that time Jesus began to preach and to say, 'Repent, for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand (Matthew 4:17, NKJV)." "The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He has anointed Me to preach the gospel to the poor; He has sent Me to heal the broken hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed; to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord (Luke 4:18-19, NKJV)."

The reason Christ came is to save sinners (1 Timothy 1:15); therefore, one of the elementary things we should preach to sinners is that they need to be saved. We should see how many people God can use us to get saved this year. The most important



decision people can make in the earth today is to ask God to save them. If our salvation is not that important to us or we don' have a readiness to go to Heaven, we won't witness about Jesus to others so they can be saved. To people we don't witness to, we're saying that we don't care if they go to hell. The devil has a serious campaign to get people to go to hell, and God only has us to witness and cause people to repent and go to Heaven. It is a desperate situation that people be saved because if they die and they're not saved, they go to hell (Ezekiel 18:4). We can't pretend that we're saved so we need to make our calling and election sure (2 Peter 1:10-11). "Take heed to yourselves and to the doctrine. Continue in them, for in doing this you will save both yourself those who hear you (1 Timothy 4:16, NKJV)." Some people are not going to heaven because they're not interested in having Jesus as their Lord and Savior (John 3:17-21).

In Luke 4:18-19, the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand because we have the Holy Spirit when we witness to someone to be saved. Jesus said the Kingdom of Heaven is available now for people to be saved, "To proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord (Luke 4:19, NJKV)." In Luke 4:18-19, Jesus' ministry addresses all of life's circumstances; He came to comfort the poor and brokenhearted, set the captives free, give sight to the blind, and deliver the oppressed. Deliverance is not easy, that's why we need Jesus to help us endure to the end. There's only one thing the devil wants us to give up and that's Heaven. "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain in the Lord (1 Corinthians 15:58, NKJV)."



• From the GCJ Women's Department: "Encountering the Heart of God"

In prayer recently, the Spirit compelled me to ask God to show me His heart. I hesitated and asked the Spirit "are you sure?" I had never asked this of God before. And when I did, God became more real to me than ever before. He said, "I'll show you my heart if you show me yours." I was blown away by experiencing such intimacy with God—He drew me in, and the tears began to flow. You see, no matter how much you have heard about God, until you show Him your heart, the reality of God escapes you. You might say, but wait... doesn't the Bible say that God knows my heart already? Yes, but He doesn't want you to show Him your heart for His sake, He wants you to show Him your heart for your sake. Ladies, I encourage you, the next time you pray, take off the fig leaves—intentionally expose your whole self to the Father—seek Him with an open (whole) heart. And while your heart is open, pick up your Bible and endeavor to learn who God truly is. It is in these moments of seeking that you can encounter the heart of God: "And you will seek Me and find Me, when you search for Me with all your heart" (Jer. 29:13 NKJV).
